

W. Broadway traffic pattern changes near Arbutus Station start August 12

August 9, 2024

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood building the future Arbutus Station. With the completion of the dismantling and removal of both tunnel boring machines (TBMs) this summer, the traffic configuration on W. Broadway, Maple and Cypress streets will change beginning August 12. In addition, the Arbutus Greenway detour via Cypress Street will also reopen for cyclists.

Throughout this work, we remain committed to keeping residents and businesses updated on our progress as we advance this major transit infrastructure project in your community.

Timing

- During regular work hours from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. on August 12 the team will adjust the traffic signals at Maple and Cypress streets and eradicate the existing road lines between Arbutus and Burrard streets.
- Some overnight work is required to repaint the road lines between Arbutus and Burrard streets.

What to expect

- Some elevated noise related to the line eradication between 8 – 10 p.m.
- Traffic changes:
 - There will be one lane in each direction on W. Broadway between Arbutus and Burrard Street at all times.
 - Maple Street north of W. Broadway will be closed to vehicles and cyclists.
 - Cypress Street north of W. Broadway will be reopened to vehicles and cyclists to facilitate north-south access to the neighbourhood and businesses on the north side of W. Broadway.
 - Left turns from W. Broadway onto Cypress Street and from W. Broadway westbound onto Maple Street will be allowed at all times.
- Arbutus Greenway Detour:
 - Cyclists are encouraged to use the Arbutus Greenway detour via Cypress Street, W. 7th Avenue and W. 10th Avenue. (see Arbutus Greenway detour map below)

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

The project strives to be a good neighbour during all activities. Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to, installing white noise back-up signals on equipment where possible, installing noise barriers around sources of noise, conducting the noisiest activities during the day, directing lights away from residential buildings, and monitoring activities to adapt mitigations as needed to minimize impacts on our neighbours.

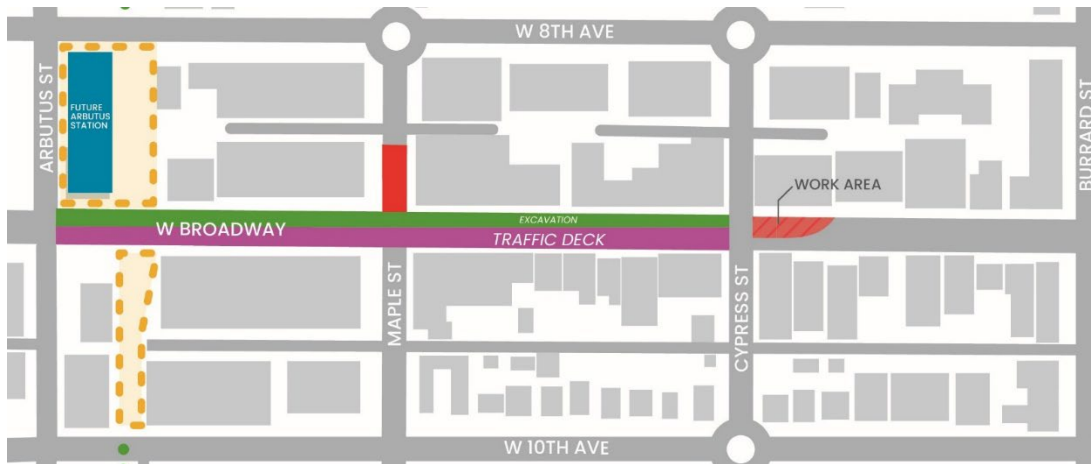

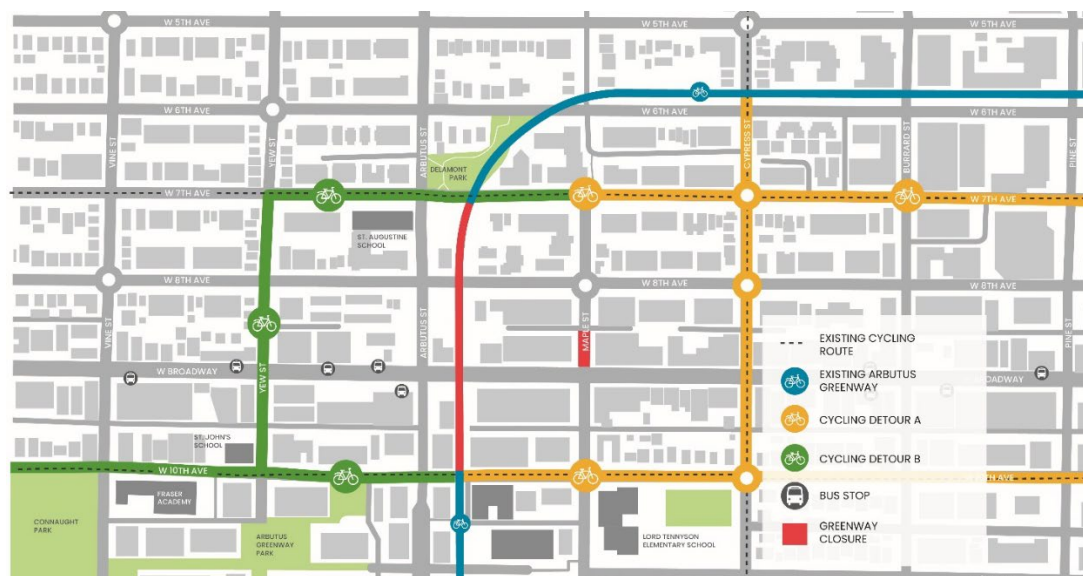
