



Fall update on construction of the future OAK-VGH Station – includes night work

September 19, 2024

The future Oak-VGH Station is taking shape in your neighbourhood. Through the fall, crews continue to focus on the construction of the second level of the underground station structure. To complete this work efficiently, we will continue working primarily during the day with regular night work. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses updated on our progress as we advance this major transit project in your community.

What to expect during daytime work

- Typical hours of work are from Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work that begins earlier or work on Sunday and holidays.
- Some elevated noise related to specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes and increased trucking activity related to materials delivery and concrete pours.
- Pedestrians will be detoured around work as required.

What to expect at night

- Regular night work is ongoing: hours can range from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Construction Activities •

Concrete pours.

- Deliveries of materials using trucks and cranes.
- Activities to support construction • inside the tunnels.
- Welding, waterproofing, rebar • installation and carpentry under the traffic deck.
- Preparation for building the emergency exit on Oak Street.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rebar installation, crane movement, ventilation fans and deliveries.
- During concrete pours, trucks are • required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional backup alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to • accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night and concrete pour activities.
- Lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.



Traffic

- Regular temporary lane closures on • W. Broadway on weekdays between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., overnight or on weekends to support construction activities.
- Temporary lane closures on W. Broadway, Oak Street and Laurel Street may be implemented to support concrete pour activities.
- Some work may require the temporary restriction of parking on Laurel Street.



Mitigations

- Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:
 - \cap Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
 - White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
 - Directing lights away from 0 residential buildings.
 - Using quieter models of 0 equipment at night, such as hand tools.
