



Track installation on the elevated guideway continues through fall 2024 includes intermittent night work

September 20, 2024

The elevated guideway connecting VCC-Clark Station to the future Great Northern Way-Emily Carr Station is progressing in your neighbourhood. Construction of the structure was completed in spring 2024 and work to install tracks for the SkyTrain will continue through the fall.

We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses updated on our progress as we advance this major transit project in your community.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 9 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities. ٠
- Temporary traffic changes and increased trucking activity related to material delivery and occasional concrete • pours.
- Pedestrians will be detoured around work as required. •

What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. •
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety. •

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Traffic

- Closures:
 - Earl Finning Way between Fraser and Foley streets.

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- Foley Street north of parking access lane.
- Fraser Street north side closed at E.
 1st Avenue and Earl Finning Way.
- No parking:
 - Along the north side of Great Northern Way, from 565 Great Northern Way west to Thornton Street.
 - Along Earl Finning Way, Foley, and Fraser streets.
 - Drivers are encouraged to use existing parkades.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, track installation, crane movement and deliveries.
- During concrete pours, trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning, and use traditional backup alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.



Mitigations

- Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:
 - Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
 - White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
 - Directing lights away from residential buildings.
 - Using quieter equipment at night, such as hand tools.
